A quick review of our financial statements will show that the Foundation is growing its endowment while maintaining a strong operating cash position. During 2015 we set the stage so we could increase our programs in 2016 while reducing our operating overhead.

All of that could not have been accomplished without you — our volunteers and our financial supporters. Please accept my thanks for a job well done. Our **Summer Twilight Concerts** were a huge success as evidenced by the record turnouts. The **First Thursdays** cultural arts program

continued to surprise us with a variety of world-class performers. **DMF Talks** probably raised our collective IQs by 5-10% with their interesting, informative presentations on a variety of current topics. The Young Del Mar Committee outdid themselves with their **Easter Egg Hunt**, **4th of July Parade**, **Halloween Spooktacular Bonfire** and a variety of other events throughout the year. In addition, we sponsored a number of social meet-and-greets that allowed folks to connect with friends and meet their neighbors.

While all of these activities were going on, bringing all of us in the Del Mar area together, our Grants committee was helping out in other areas, making grants to help turn good ideas into reality.

To provide future support for all of our activities and the grants we make, we kicked off our **Community Builder Campaign** in 2015. The success of this campaign will increase our ability to continue to provide exciting new programs and events free of charge in the future. Our fundraising goal of \$500,000 is ambitious; however, by the end of 2015 we already had pledges from the community totaling nearly half our goal.

The time, effort and money that all of you — our volunteers, sponsors and donors — contributed was amazing. Thank you for all that you did to make 2015 special.

2015 Year in Review

Grants

As we all know, Del Mar is a wonderful place to live. Nature provides a lot of our magic, with help from the City of Del Mar, numerous community-based organizations and hundreds of individuals. The Del Mar Foundation strives to grant more than \$40,000 per year to worthy projects, and we continued this tradition of supporting the City of Del Mar and local organizations in 2015. During the year, we partnered with the Friends of the Powerhouse to purchase a new rescue boat for the Del Mar Lifeguards. We also provided a grant to **Del Mar Community Connections** to support its popular Tuesday Lunch Connection program enabling otherwise homebound seniors to connect with peers over a balanced meal at the Del Mar Community Building. The program includes food, speakers and music and serves about 400 seniors annually. The Foundation also provided funding to the San Dieguito River Valley Conservancy for an extension of the scenic and popular River Path Del Mar connecting the Grand Street Bridge with Jimmy Durante Boulevard along San Dieguito Road, due to be completed in June 2016. We were also pleased to partner with a local family to fund the installation of a pet friendly drinking fountain at the entrance to Del Mar Shores Park at 225 9th Street. Additional grants went to

the Community Emergency Response Team, to

improve its emergency services network; Free Flight

Bird Sanctuary, to fund its docent program; **Del Mar TV**;

improved lighting for the Powerhouse; and a generous

supply of firefighter hats to be distributed to all "junior firefighters" fortunate enough to tour the **Del Mar Fire Department**.

Events

The Young Del Mar committee continued its mission of providing memory making family events and activities for the Del Mar community by hosting Parents Nights Out at local Del Mar venues like Hotel Indigo, L'Auberge Del Mar, and Zel's Del Mar. Young Del Mar also hosted the wildly popular annual Easter Egg Hunt in Seagrove Park, which attracted over 300 attendees and featured a full sized Easter Bunny (who sounded remarkably like William Lutz). On July 4th, in partnership with the City, Young Del Mar took over Coast Blvd and held its

annual **Independence Day Parade.** In October, the annual **Spooktacular Beach Bonfire** lit up a Friday night for hundreds of Del

Mar area kids who enjoyed spooky stories, s'mores and more. A three-part parent education series held in conjunction with Del Mar Hills and Del Mar Heights elementary schools featured a panel of parenting experts, including local favorite Susie Walton. Trip to the Tropics, a new cultural event, brought an entire Chamorrow community to the Powerhouse for an immersive event featuring food and dance.

The **Cultural Arts** committee continued its perennially sold out **First Thursdays** concert series at the Powerhouse, which featured such artists as Gustavo Romero, The Claire Lynch Band, North Coast Repertory Theatre, Eve Selis and more. Our equally popular **Bluegrass**

and Beyond concert series attracted an array of world class musicians, including The John Jorgenson Quintet, Blue Highway and the Railsplitters.

The traditional Summer Twilight Concert series brought bands on five different evenings to the outdoor stage at Del Mar's Powerhouse Park where our community enjoyed food, dance, an always priceless Del Mar sunset, and, of course, music from great bands including: Hotel California: A Tribute to the Eagles; Mark Wood and the Parrothead Band; Berkley, Hart, Selis and Twang; Tim Flannery And The Lunatic Fringe; The Mighty Untouchables; and The Soul Persuaders. We owe a debt of gratitude to our Twilight Concert sponsorship partners: Jake's Del Mar, Jelley Properties, Lutz Insurance Services, Pacifica Del Mar, Poseidon on the Beach, Zel's Del Mar, Del Mar Thoroughbred Club, LAZ Parking, Marrokal Design & Remodeling, D'Arcy Capital Management, Del Mar Rendezvous, Whole Foods Market Del Mar, and a \$10,000 grant made possible through the Office of County Supervisor Dave Roberts. We are also grateful to our major donors, who received preferred "front row" seating as a token of our appreciation for their support.

For those with inquiring minds, the **DMF Talks** speaker series provided abundant food for thought. The 2015 edition featured such varied speakers as Rabbi Ben Kamin discussing his recent book "Dangerous Friendships"; Dr. Jan Karlseder of the Salk Institute on how to "Keep Tabs on Your Telomeres: The Role of Chromosome Ends in Aging and Disease"; Dr. Debi Kilb from Scripps Institute of Oceanography on "Our Next Earthquake"; Dr. Allen Shafter, Astronomy Department Chair at SDSU, speaking on "Seeing Stars: Time Domain Astronomy"; and Dr. Thomas Deerinck of UCSD's National Center of Microscopy and Imaging Research who shared stunning images of the brain during his talk, "Beauty and the Brain: Blending Art and Science."

The Del Mar Foundation Special Events committee held two beach cleanup events in partnership with the Del Mar Rotary Club: one in April in celebration of Earth Day, and the second in September to toast the end of summer. We staged another annual favorite, the Halloween Dog Parade, at Powerhouse Park, which featured dozens of canines in costumes. Proving that it is never a dog eat dog world in Del Mar, treats were provided for participants both two legged and four. We also hosted several Meet and Greets throughout the year, designed to bring out friends and neighbors for casual meetings over wine and appetizers at Seasalt Del Mar, Sbicca, L'Auberge and Zel's Del Mar. We were especially pleased to honor our donors and volunteers at our third annual Celebrate Community gathering outside the Del Mar Community Building, which featured local band Strange Brew along with some tasty treats for all.

Endowments

Finally, the Del Mar Foundation continues to manage its own Community Endowment, along with the Lagoon Endowment, and the Alvarado House Fund held by the Del Mar Historical Society. With over \$2 million in total managed funds, the Del Mar Foundation fulfills a valuable and unique role in the community.



Financial Report

The following financial statements are excerpts from the 2015 Financial Statements that were compiled by the certified public accounting firm of Friedman Brannen LLP. A complete copy of this compiled report is available from the Del Mar Foundation office upon request.

Statement of Activities

In 2015 the Foundation raised \$239,283 in donations. The Foundation received \$111,650 in program income, which includes ticket sales, grants and sponsorships for the various community programs it produced. These programs include the Twilight Concerts, the Cultural Arts events, and the Young Del Mar programs. Expenses of \$74,140 were incurred in producing these programs, resulting in a surplus of \$37,510 from these activities.

The Foundation awarded \$24,903 in grants to support community activities and projects. Grants were made to Del Mar Television Foundation to create videos of the DMF Talks speaker series, to Friends of the Powerhouse to partially purchase a new inflatable rescue boat for the Del Mar Lifeguards, to San Dieguito River Valley Conservancy to help with the construction of the southern extension of River Path Del Mar trail, and to the Del Mar Fire Department to purchase plastic fire hats to give away to local children. The Del Mar Foundation identifies and develops new grant ideas on a continuous basis with the support of its donors and volunteers.

Management, General and Fundraising expenses totaled \$138,399. These expenses were incurred to fundraise and sustain operations, and for general administrative activities, including support for our programs.

Statement of Financial Position (Balance Sheet) and Net Asset Analysis

The net assets of the Foundation as of 12/31/15 amounted to \$2,353,070 of which \$865,918 were in Operating Funds and Reserves, all of which can

ultimately be used for the payment of operating expenses or grants. This operating fund net asset balance includes \$161,250 in pledges receivable, meaning that the funds have been pledged, but the pledge payment has not yet been received. As these pledges are paid, these funds will become unrestricted.

The Community Endowment, which is the endowment to be used for the support of the Foundation's expenses and grants, had net assets of \$1,062,023 on 12/31/15. Unrestricted net assets in this endowment fund amounted to \$356,258. Permanently Restricted net assets totaled \$705,765, of which \$642,500 was from contributions that have been received and invested, and \$9,000 was from pledges receivable and \$28,500 was pledges written off as uncollectible.

On 12/31/15 the Lagoon Endowment had net assets of \$677,369, all of which are Temporarily Restricted. This fund is overseen by the Foundation for the future benefit of the San Dieguito Lagoon maintenance. These funds were provided to the Foundation by the San Dieguito River Park Joint Powers Authority.

Beginning in 2013, the Del Mar Foundation is managing the funds of the Del Mar Historical Society's Alvarado House Fund with assets of \$72,522 on 12/31/15. The funds are intended for the future transfer and restoration of the Alvarado House once a permanent home for it has been identified.

Explanatory Notes of Significant Accounting Policies

Method of Accounting

The financial statements have been prepared on the accrual basis of accounting.

Basis of Presentation

The Foundation follows the provision of Statement of Financial Accounting Standards ("SFAS") No. 117, Financial Statements of Not-for-Prof it Organizations. SFAS No. 117 requires that net assets, revenue, gains, expenses, and losses be classified as unrestricted, temporarily restricted, and permanently restricted.

A summary of the net asset categories included in the accompanying financial statements is as follows:

Unrestricted: Unrestricted net assets included amounts that are available for support of the Foundation's operational and administrative functions and amounts that are available to support community activities and charitable endeavors at the discretion of the Foundation's Board of Directors.

Temporarily Restricted: Temporarily restricted amounts represent funds, the principal of which may be expended in the future for a specific purpose (e.g. the Lagoon Endowment Fund) and contributions receivable that upon receipt will be transferred to unrestricted funds.

Permanently Restricted: Permanently restricted net assets represent those assets contributed to the foundation where the original dollar value is to remain in perpetuity as a permanent endowment of the Foundation.

Investments

Investments consist of marketable securities. Marketable securities consist of U.S. government securities and debt and equity securities. Equity securities with readily determinable values and all debt securities are carried at fair value. Fair value is determined by-quoted market prices on the last business day of the year.

Investments acquired by gift are recorded at their fair market value at the date of the gift. The Foundation's policy is to liquidate all gifts of investments immediately upon receipt.
